What inspired you to become a teacher?

To put it simply, I wanted to talk to people about history. I've always loved the subject and I enjoy talking about it with friends and colleagues. The idea of teaching history as a profession was both exciting and daunting. It was something that people were encouraging me to do for years. It was daunting because of the doubts you have in your mind about whether you can do it; but it was exciting because I could encourage students to give history a chance, to engage with the subject, read the stories and understand how the past shapes the future. It is a profession where you can have a real impact on people's lives.

Why did you choose North East SCITT?

Tell us about your route into teaching

I worked in the marketing department of a multi-academy trust for six years after leaving university. I had wanted to be a teacher since I was little but I was never brave enough to do it - I admired anyone who dared! Working in a school, my confidence grew and when I decided I wanted a different challenge I knew it was time for me to be brave and apply to train to teach.

Why did you choose North East SCITT?

What would you say to anyone thinking of teaching?

Yes, it feels scary and yes, there will be times when you wonder if you are making the right choice. But those doubts will soon fade when you are in the classroom, teaching a subject you love. What has been your favourite part of training so far?

How does SCITT differ from your previous career?

I had the freedom in my old job to manage my day, however, in teaching, you have to be in certain places at set times for lessons, break duties etc. I can't just make a cup of tea when I want anymore!

Do you have any tips or advice for potential trainees?

Be organised right from the start. Make lists and buy an academic diary (and a BIG bag - you'll need it!). Plan lessons in advance. Build friendships with your fellow trainees - they are the only ones who will fully understand the roller-coaster that is teacher training. And just believe in yourself - believe you can do it!

Career changer - primary trainee

Tell us about your route into teaching

Before starting university, I took a gap year to teach abroad with Project Trust, an educational charity in Namibia, and discovered my passion and love for teaching - I knew I had to come back and get a degree so that I could complete my teacher training. I planned to study journalism and had a place at Cardiff waiting for me, but when I discovered how much I loved teaching I had to change my plans.

Why did you choose North East SCITT?

The SCITT offered a two week paid teaching internship for undergraduate university students. I heard about the internship, applied and completed my placement at Browney Academy - one of their trust schools. While there, I experienced teaching and learned more about the SCITT and it won me over. I knew North East SCITT were the people to complete my teaching training with.

What would you say to anyone thinking of teaching?

It's not just a cliché when they say teaching is one of the most rewarding careers - it is. You see your impact day in, day out and you get to make thirty new friends every year. If teaching is for you, you will know it as soon as you step into the classroom. It will be scary but eventually you find your feet.

What has been your favourite part of training so far?

Watching myself develop into the teacher I am going to be. When I stood in front of my first placement class for my first lesson, I was trembling with fear and nervousness. Three weeks later, while on the same placement, I had taught my first full day and it felt amazing. I was no longer trembling. I was excited and confident.

Do you have any tips or advice for potential trainees?

Don't let your worries stop you from entering the classroom, we all make mistakes and it's more than OK. It's important for the children you work with to see you slip up from time to time; it lets them know that it's OK for them to slip up too. Sometimes getting things wrong is how we learn and grow.



You also need at least a Grade C/Grade 4 in GCSE English and maths, and a Grade C/Grade 4 or above in GCSE science for primary school training. Applicants with relevant industrial or commercial experience are also very welcome to apply.

With the expertise of *MERIT*, we are committed to ensuring that applicants from minority backgrounds are supported in fair access during the application and selection process. *MERIT* provides support mechanisms to guide BME candidates wishing to train as a teacher.
